# Our Purpose and Our Cause

Many years ago, Service Enterprises, Inc. (SEI) began providing training in work skills to individuals with varying abilities. Both products have been invaluable in offering real-life work tasks for use in skill-building.

Clients label, fill and seal bags, and pack cases of whole kernel and microwave popcorn. Packaged into 2 lb and 5 lb bags, Morgan Brand Popcorn is a popular and loved product currently sold throughout central and southern Minnesota.

Our coffee partnership for Jumpy Monkey Coffee is through coffee roasters in Sioux City, Iowa. Clients work at tasks of labeling, filling, grinding and sealing bags of coffee and preparing product for our delivery routes.

Morgan Brand Popcorn and Jumpy Monkey Coffee make great fundraiser products, as well. Several area organizations have used our products to fundraise, which provides more work for the individuals SEI supports. We call that a Win! Win!

Individuals in our assembly area do other contract work for local businesses including small parts assembly and product fulfillment, but our popcorn and coffee products are extra-special to us. They've been our products behind our purpose and our cause – afterall, it's our motto of "Popcorn with a Purpose and Coffee with a Cause" that keeps SEI Assembly area hard at work.












